

**The Prom Report.**

The report of the receipts and expenses of this year's Junior Promenade appeared recently. While the expenditures were a little larger this year than in former years, the increase was due to expenditures which have not figured in former reports, namely, insurance, lawyer's fees, rebates and class debts. The increasing proportions of the Promenade too, made a cost of \$300 more necessary, but this was in a measure compensated for by a reduction in the usual large printing expenses.

In accordance with the custom of former years \$400 was lent to the *Naves*, which will be repaid at the beginning of next season.

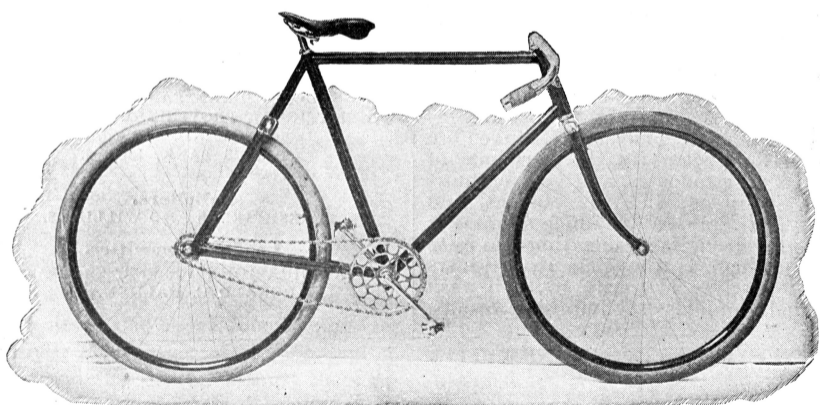
