Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Mustered out of the service of the United States at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

J. A. Ripley, '98, was mustered into service May 19, 1898, in Light Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 4. Furloughed for thirty days, Sept. 16. Mustered out of the service of the United States at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

M. W. Rockwell, '98, enlisted May 3, 1898, in Light Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 4. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Mustered out of service at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

W. J. Shroder, '98, enlisted May 4, 1898, in Light Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers, and was mustered into United States service May 19. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 4, 1898. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Mustered out of the service of the United States at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

W. F. C. Tichborne, '98, enlisted May 4, 1898, in Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 7. Mustered out of the service of the United States at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

E. B. Treat, '98, enlisted May 4, 1898, in Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 7. Appointed Quartermaster-Sergeant May 17. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Mustered out of the service of the United States at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

Julius Tuckerman, '98, enlisted May 4, 1898, in Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 7. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Mustered out of the service of the United States at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

D. C. Twichell, '98, enlisted May 4, 1898, in Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Appointed Corporal May 4. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 4. Appointed Sergeant May 13. Commissioned Second Lieutenant, Company F, Third Regiment, Connecticut Volunteers, Oct. 10. Promoted to First Lieutenant and Adjutant Nov. 4. The Third Connecticut was encamped at Camp Meade, Pa., Camp Marion, Summerville, S. C., and Camp Onward, Savannah, Ga. Mustered out of the service of the United States March 20, 1899, at Camp Onward.

W. N. Vaile, '98, enlisted May 4, 1898, in Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 4. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. In Cambridge (Mass.), Hospital with typhoid fever Oct. 3 to Nov. 14. Mustered out in Hartford, Conn., Nov. 17. (Furlough extended on account of sickness, from Oct. 16 to Nov. 17.)

James W. Wadsworth, Jr., '98, enlisted July 24, 1898, in Battery A, Pennsylvania Light Artillery, United States Volunteers. Went to Newport News, Va., and from there sailed on the Mani-

toba for Porto Rico, Aug. 5. Sailed from Porto Rico on the Mississippi Sept. 3, arriving in New York Sept. 10. Went the same day to Philadelphia, where the whole Battery was furloughed. Mustered out of service with Battery at Philadelphia in Nov., 1898. Sailed for Manila Feb. 3, 1899, accredited Clerk to Colonel Page of the Third United States Infantry.

Frederick T. Anderson, '98 S., enlisted June 17, 1898, in the Engineers' Division, Connecticut Naval Battalion. Enlisted as Fireman, First-class; rated Machinist, Second-class, Aug. 1; Machinist, First-class, in September. Detailed to patrol mines in New Haven Harbor, May 12, 1898, as Fireman on launch and yacht Sparta. After enlistment sent to the U. S. S. Minnesota at Boston, then to U. S. S. New Hampshire, and from there to U. S. S. Kanawha. On Cuban station under Commodore Watson, the Kanawha served as a despatch boat. Held Port Gibara on the northwest coast of Cuba for two weeks in August, relieving the U. S. S. Nashville. Cruised around Porto Rico, carrying despatches and mail. Ordered home the latter part of September. Touched at Port Royal and Newport News. Arrived in New York Oct. 4.

R. E. Broatch, '98 S., enlisted May 17, 1898, in Battery C, First Regiment, Heavy Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went to Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May, 1898. Appointed a Sergeant May 20, 1898. Seriously ill with typhoid fever from Sept. 7, 1898, until Nov. 1. In connection with Battery C, was on the Signal Corps. Mustered out of the United States service Nov. 29, 1898, although dated Oct. 31, the day of muster-out of organization.

Previous to the war was a member of Second Section, Brigade Signal Corps, and Company H, Second Regiment, C. N. G., for a short time.

F. V. Chappell, '98 S., enlisted May 4, 1898, in Light Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers, and was appointed Sergeant the same day. Went into camp at Niantic, Conn., May 7. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Mustered out of service at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

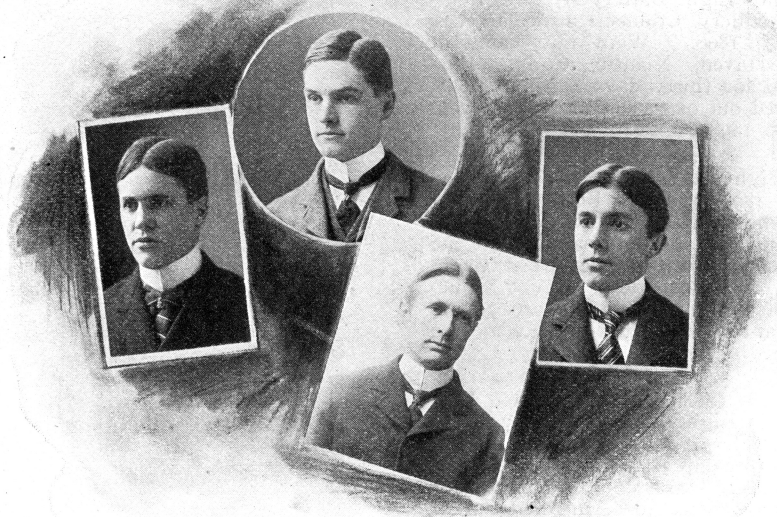
Austin Cheney, '98 S., enlisted during the latter part of May, 1898, in Light Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Niantic, Conn., May 24, 1898. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Mustered out of service at New Haven, Oct. 25, 1898.

R. H. Cumings, '98 S., enlisted May 4, 1898, in Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 4, 1898. Was assigned to the Commissary Department June 4, and continued in that service until Sept. 27, when relieved by reason of removal of subsistence department from post. Was then furloughed for balance of the thirty days. During latter part of his furlough, was taken ill with malarial rheumatism, and on Oct. 20, was sent to New Haven Hospital, where he remained till Dec. 10, 1898. His discharge was made out and dated Dec. 8, 1898, though it stated that he was mustered out Oct. 25. Mustered out of service at New Haven Oct. 25, 1898.

George W. Dulany, Jr., '98 S., enlisted in the Navy Feb. 25, 1898, with the First Division, Connecticut Naval Battalion, and was mustered into the United States service June 15. Rated as "able bodied seaman." Was Acting Quartermaster, Second-class. Was Acting Chief Quartermaster of special detail May 9 to May 21, on Monitor U. S. S. Wyandotte, New Haven to Boston. At Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., from June 6 to June 15, then ordered to U. S. S. Minnesota at Boston, Mass. Was on board the Minnesota until Aug. 25. Honorably discharged from service Aug. 25, 1898.

Frederick T. Gause, '98 S., enlisted May 4, 1898, in Light Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers. Went into camp at Camp Haven, Niantic, Conn., May 7, 1898. Furloughed for thirty days Sept. 16. Honorably discharged from service Aug. 26, 1898.

William Orville Hickok, IV, '98 S., enlisted shortly before the war in Company D, Eighth Regiment, Pennsylvania National Guard. Went into camp at Mt. Gretna, Pa., with Company D, when the first call for volunteers was issued. At Mt. Gretna he was transferred to Light Battery A, Pennsylvania Volunteer Artillery. While Mr. Hickok was ill with congestion of the lungs, Battery A was mustered into service and he lost his place. He then communicated with Colonel Roosevelt about joining the Rough Riders, in reply receiving orders to report at once at San Antonio, Tex. He was unable to proceed any further than Louisville,

Ky., on account of his recent illness and spent the three following weeks near there on a stock farm recuperating, again joining Battery A, which was then guarding the ship yards at Newport News, Va., the Rough Riders in the meantime having sailed from Tampa for Cuba. Sailed for Porto Rico Aug. 5, 1898, arriving there Aug. 10. Sailed from Porto Rico Sept. 3. Furloughed at Philadelphia on Sept. 11, for sixty days. Honorably discharged at Philadelphia Nov. 20, 1898.

J. L. Howard, Jr., '98 S., enlisted May 14, 1898, in Battery A, First Regiment Artillery, Connecticut Volunteers.
