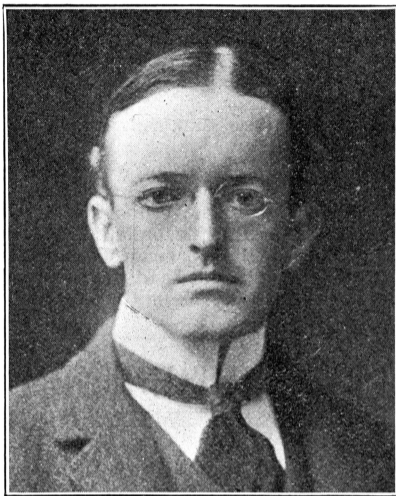
'92—A daughter was born to Mr. and
