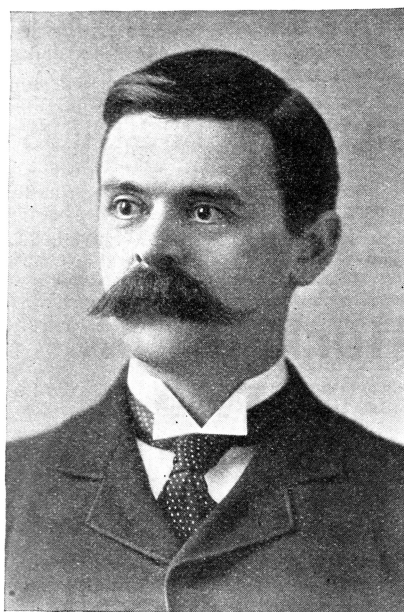


Honor System Rejected.

Rev. Dr. A. J. Behrends.

The Rev. Dr. A. J. F. Behrends, pastor of the Central Congregational Church of Brooklyn, N. Y., died of Bright's disease complicated with heart trouble, Tuesday, May 22, at his home in Brooklyn, aged sixty-one years. He was the Lyman Beecher lecturer in the Divinity School in 1890, and in the same year Yale gave him the degree of Doctor of Sacred Theology.
